## Test Format

Thai Language Proficiency Test is hosted by Technology Promotion

Association (Thailand-Japan). The test objective is to evaluate foreigners

abilities in Thai language. The test will not result in “pass” or “fail”, but will

indicate the test taker's level (beginner, elementary, intermediate, advanced,

or proficient). \*The test paper should be written completely in Thai letters.

## Level Information

**1. Beginner** Those who are at the beginner level are able to read and write Thai, and are able to understand basic vocabulary and grammar. They also can create short sentences about their daily life situations.

**2. Elementary** Those who are at the elementary level are able to read and write Thai fluently, and understand daily life vocabulary and grammar well. They also have good listening comprehension and are able to communicate in daily life situations.

**3. Intermediate** Those who are at the intermediate level are able to understand complicated sentences, and are able to communicate properly. They can understand Thai articles in general topic on newspapers or magazines, and also are able to use Thai language at the workplace.

**4. Advanced** Those who are at the advanced level are able to understand more complicated sentences than intermediate level sentences. They can read, listen, and understand content about economics, politics, and social issues on newspapers, magazines, T.V., or radio channels. They can also use Thai language confidently at the workplace and able to live in Thailand without language problems.

**5. Proficient** Those who are at the proficient level are able to use Thai languages proficiently as Thai people in all skill areas.
